





Rules & Regulations

We Are Not Responsible For Children Left Unattended!

- 1. Only members of the Society will be allowed to compete for prizes.
- 2. Membership fee 2025 \$7.00 (allows entry on Saturday).
- In all articles of manufacture, grain, seeds and produce, no person shall enter in the same class more than one article of each kind, which must be their own manufacture or growth.
- 4. All animals and articles must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor, and all vegetables to be growth of 2025.
- 5. The judges shall have the power to decide whether the animal or article is worthy of a prize or not, and where there is little or no competition, they are to decide what prizes they are entitled to, if any, but cannot change from one class to another.
- ALL HOMECRAFT DIVISION EXHIBITS (Classes 25-34) MUST BE IN THE ARENA NO LATER THAN 12 NOON ON FRIDAY, AUGUST 8, 2025. JUDGING OF EXHIBITS WILL COMMENCE AT 1:00 P.M., EXHIBITS MUST NOT BE REMOVED UNTIL 5:00 P.M. ON SATURDAY, AUGUST 9.
- 7. No person shall be allowed to interfere with judges.
- 8. If any dispute occurs, the treasurer will hold premiums until settled.
- 9. Fair Board to pay prizes no later than October 25, 2025.
- Parties violating any of these rules will be subject to expulsion from the Society and forfeit all prizes they may be entitled to.
- 11. A percentage only of prize money will be paid if directors consider the receipts insufficient to pay in full.

- 12. Door of hall will be closed at 5:00 p.m. sharp on the last day and only those who have exhibits will be allowed to enter the hall.
- 13. Only entries for listed categories will be accepted to the Homecraft Division, which runs from Class 25 through to Class 34.
- 14. Each paid concession receives one pass.
- 15. All exhibitors must have their own Liability Insurance.
- 16. Members are entitled to one admission to grounds on their member's ticket.
- 17. The Society will not be responsible for any accident on the track or grounds.
- 18. Animals not under sufficient control shall not be allowed to compete.
- 19. The Society reserves the right to interpret its own rules and regulations, and should any dispute or question arise not provided for in the rules and regulations, the decision of the Board of Directors will be final.
- 20. All exhibits shown at owner's risk against loss or damage.
- No exhibitor or spectator shall be allowed to show disrespect or use abusive language to any official. For violations of this the offender may be removed from the grounds.
- 22. Exhibitors to bring own bedding for animals.
- 23. Call the Homecraft Director for exhibitor number 705-448-2034.







Rules and Regulations

- 1. The contestant must be able to pedal the tractor without assistance
- 2. Pedal tractors will be furnished for all contestants
- 3. All contestants must wear shoes
- 4. In case of a tie, there will be a pull-off to determine the winner.
- 5. Both boys and girls are eligible to enter, age limit of 10 years with 75 pounds maximum weight.

There will be three classes of contestants, which are:

- Light Weight: 30 to 45 lbs
- Middle Weight: 46 to 60 lbs
- Heavy Weight: 61 to 75 lbs
- 6. The judge's decision is final for all pulls.
- 7. All contestants must be present by the time of the pull. The required signature of a parent or guardian releases the Wilberforce Agricultural Society from any legal or financial responsibility due to an accident as a result of this event.
- 8. Registration for the tractor pull will take place at tennis courts prior to pull start.
- 9. Only the first 15 children for each class to register will be able to participate. Child must be accompanied by a parent or guardian at time of registration.





DO enter something in every section you can. It's fun to compete. If no one else enters, you're bound to get a prize.

Do use rubber bands to attach entry tags to jars and some other items...they are handy

DO RESIST the urge to FIX your child's entry. It must be their own work.

DO use safety pins NEVER straight pins to attach tags to fabric items.

Don't use plastic wrap to cover your food entries, use clear plastic bags.

Don't put too many or too few items on the plate. If the description says 3 cookies, it must be 3, no more, no less, or your entry will be disqualified.

Notes and Helpful Hints to Enter Homecraft Division Competition

Call our Homecraft Director (705) 448-2034 to get an Exhibitor number. This number is written on all your entry tags and your entry form.

Pick up entry tags (if possible), fill them out and attach to your entries before you bring them to the Fair. They can be picked up in Wilberforce at the Municipal Office, Visitor Information Centre (Curling Club), and Agnew's General Store. Fill out one entry tag for EACH item you are entering.

Entries can be dropped off on Thursday, August 7th 6:30 pm to 8pm and Friday, August 8th, 9 am to 12 noon. The Exhibit hall closes at 12 noon for judging.

Each person entering items must have a separate Entry Form (each child must have their own form). Adults must pay the \$7 membership fee at time of entering, and this membership allows free admission to the Fair. Children under 16 years old do not pay to enter. We love kids!

Remember, you can only enter ONE item per Section. For example, you can only enter one photo of an animal in Class 33 Section 1. Pick your best one!
